

UDAAN is committed towards the welfare and empowerment of special needs children of our society whose life is heavily deprived of the basic necessities of childhood, such as, education, nutrition, recreation, etc. Besides ensuring opportunities of education, health and nutrition, play and survival and multi-dimensional activities for these children, empowerment is also attempted through parent meetings, counselling sessions, health camps, workshops, etc.



The number of children in Udaan from inception is 156 and we have been successful in mainstreaming 75 children till date.

Presently there are **35 children** attending regular special education classes and therapies.

Regarding the various therapies the Udaan children attend, **32** get **speech therapy**, **28** **occupational therapy** and **13** children get **physiotherapy**.





The Mother and Child Clinic is conducted twice a week (Wednesdays and Fridays) from 11 am to 1pm and has catered to more than **500 patients till date.**



This year Udaan children have been put under the “**Educational Sponsorship**” programme. This programme is for those children who once attended Udaan and are now mainstreamed into other schools. **From Jan.’24 onwards, 6 such children (Kritanjali Guha, Roshni Pandey, Piu Halder, Priyanshu Prasad, Eshan Das and Ananya Routh) have been receiving monthly scholarships of rupees one thousand per month each.**

Five Parent-Teacher interactive sessions were held in which apart from distributing the yearly reports of the children, the parents were guided and updated regarding the various issues related to their children’s progress, the therapies, health and hygiene, discipline, Jan Seva rules and guidelines, etc. The parents are also given the opportunity to express and share their daily or future concerns and worries of their children and efforts are made to counsel and guide them so that they are better equipped to deal with those issues.



Other than the Annual Sports held every winter, Jan Seva celebrates a number of festivals and events every year most of which are inclusive events involving the children of both ECCEC and Udaan, thus promoting **INCLUSION**. It includes Rabindra Jayanti, Rath Yatra, Raksha Bandhan, Ganesh Chaturthi, Teachers Day, Independence Day, Vishwakarma Puja, Durga Puja, Diwali, Christmas, New Year, Saraswati Puja, Holi etc. which are also attended by our honourable board members and SICW colleagues.
